Reform of the Congolese National Police

Quick Facts

From May 13 to May 14, 2015, the International Organization for Migrations (IOM), in collaboration with the Congolese National Police (PNC), the General Directorate of Migration (DGM) and with the financial support of the US Government, has organized, in the Mbiza Hotel in Goma, a validation workshop on the capacity building activities of the Riverine, Mining and Border Police in North Kivu.

Recommendations from the workshop

Among the recommendations of the workshop, we may list :

- Establishment of a technical committee for monitoring project activities ;
- Setting up of a joint commission of award of contracts;
- Training of border police and the DGM in three centers: Mugunga in North Kivu, Ituri in the training center in Bunia and Kasapa in Katanga;
- Making available additional modules (geography-geolocation, mapping) to complete the curriculum presented by MONUSCO's riverine unit related training lacustrine police ;
- Harmonization of training modules of the mining police ...

These activities are part of the implementation of the three projects funded by the United States of America through The Bureau of International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs (INL). The overall objective is to contribute to the stabilization efforts in the Provinces of North and South Kivu, Maniema and Ituri district, while supporting the recovery and regulation of the mining sector and monitoring of land and lake borders.

The workshop started with IOM representative's welcoming message followed by INL and the Congolese National Police (PNC) representative's greetings.

This two-day workshop helped to frame the role, responsibilities and mandate of the various participating entities that are the General Directorate of Schools and Training (DGEF), the Border Police Unit of the General Directorate of Migration (DGM) and the PNC Border Police Unit.

An inventory of furniture has also been done for all units of the Mining and Hydrocarbons Police, Riverine Police and Border Police in the Province of North Kivu.
